

# From the Pastor's Desk

When Jesus died and was placed in a tomb, the disciples were grief-stricken. Before his crucifixion and death, the disciples had a plan; they knew what they were going to be doing. Jesus had called them to be his disciples and they were following him. After his death and crucifixion, they had no one to follow. Many of the disciples did not know what to do initially but they did know that their life with Jesus was over; how can you follow someone who was dead? So they decided to go back to their old livelihoods.


Isn't that what we do, too? When we are uncertain we go back to attitudes and behaviors and lives that we lived before. The familiar makes us feel comfortable. Many of us do not like to live in uncertainty and ambiguity, and yet, in life we often have to live in uncertainty and ambiguity. There is a saying that there are only two certainties in life: death and taxes. Everything else can lead to uncertainty and ambiguity.

The disciples did not like living in uncertainty and so they made a decision to return to what they knew. But then, Jesus did not stay where they put him! He was resurrected and he found the disciples and invited them to continue to follow him. Jesus invited the disciples to continue to live in a world of uncertainty and ambiguity because now they were moving into unchartered territory: now as they followed Jesus they were following a risen Lord!

There is another saying: Life is uncertain, eat dessert first! Jesus did not stay where the disciples put him and he doesn't stay where we put him, either. We crave stability and certainty in our lives and so we create illusions of both. The reality is, life is uncertain and while Jesus does not stay where we put him, he is alive in our world. As his disciples we are invited to follow him into the world with confidence that we do not make this journey alone. I guess we could eat dessert first, but I think that I would alter this saying: Life is uncertain, so always follow Jesus!

We may not know where we are going or what will happen next, but we do know that we follow a risen Savior. Thanks be to God!
