## **Full Cupboards in Our Kitchen**

The church has Shenango (Ivory pattern) China settings for about 60. The five-piece settings include a 5 oz. cup which is a very small amount for coffee/tea use after church. These cups are rarely use. Many can not remember when they were last used. We have about 24 mugs which are used frequently for meetings and Bible study groups. #### **Recycling Workshop with Recology**

On Thursday evening, February 6, two representatives from Recology came to Shoreline UMC to give us an update on the rules of recycling. This is the second year that SUMC and the Briarcrest Neighborhood Association co-sponsored an event to help the community and church members know the best practices for what goes where, when choosing to recycle. There were fifteen people in attendance who kept the presenters engaged with numerous questions about what can be recycled in the BLUE BIN and what can be sent to composting in the GREEN BIN. Because we want to be good stewards of the world that God created we are thankful for the information shared.

Here are a couple take-away's from the workshop:

-Cedar Grove who recycles our compostables (GREEN BIN) no longer takes shredded paper because of contamination from shredded credit cards and windowed envelopes. Place shredded paper in the garbage bin.

-Styrofoam can be taken to the Recology Store on west side of Aurora next to the Opus Bank just south of 155th. There is no charge for Shoreline residents. Janelle has agreed to take any styrofoam to the store if you live outside of Shoreline.

-Recology handles waste for several cities in King County; Shoreline is one, but not Lk Forest Park or Seattle. King County will no longer accept plastic bags and wraps in residential curbside recycling bins. (They formerly advised acceptance of a sack stuffed with plastic sacks the size of a soccer ball.) Residents are requested to return their clean plastic bags and wraps for recycling to area stores. You may find a nearby store from the website, <u>www.plasticfilmrecycling.org</u>, which lists stores close to you that take plastic film recyclables. Cut out paper labels.

-Aerosol food cans, such as PAM or whipped cream, can be recycled with caps removed.

-**Empty, clean, and dry** are the watch words to remember before placing items in the blue recycle bin to prevent contamination. Empty contents. Rinse bottles or items with water. Then shake the item 5 times to empty any excess water and place in the bin.

-Plastic gloves always go in the garbage.
